- Hon. Minister Stephen Dawson MLC, Minister for Regional Development; Ports; Science and Innovation; Medical Research; Kimberley attended the November Board meeting to discuss his portfolio and medical research and innovation at EMHS.

EMHS Board Committee Reports

Board Finance Committee

- The Committee discussed leave liability, workers compensation claims and the infrastructure program.
- The Committee also noted EMHS' current financial status and discussed FTE management.

Board Operational Performance and Strategy Committee

- The Committee received an update in the Electronic Medical Record (EMR) Program and the Digital Strategy.
- The Committee discussed other key items including recruitment, learning and development, emergency access and extreme risks.

EMHS Chief Executive – Dr Lesley Bennett

- Dr Lesley Bennett provided the Board with an overview of discussions from the Health Executive Committee (HEC) meetings held in November which included updates on Health Infrastructure, winter planning for 2026 and system, flow and reform.
- Dr Bennett highlighted other EMHS specific updates including the Mt Lawley Hospital transition and the RPH redevelopment.
- Dr Bennett also noted the recent announcement of her appointment to the position of Deputy Director General, Clinical Excellence Division which will begin in early 2026. Mr Philip Aylward will cover the Chief Executive role in the interim.

EMHS Site Updates



Armadale Kalamunda Group (AKG)

- The EMHS AKG Nursing and Midwifery Awards and the Length of Service Awards were both held in November.
- A governance optimisation project is underway to ensure the AKG structure is contemporary, sustainable and will be suitable to meet future operational demands.



Royal Perth Bentley Group (RPBG)

- The EMHS RPBG Nursing and Midwifery Awards, the WA Health Excellence Awards and the Interhospital Ball were held in November.
- A recent evaluation of the Medical Oncology Service expansion reflected positive results, providing EMHS residents with access to safe, best practice cancer care closer to home.

Mental Health

- RPBG Mental Health received notice it will retain Rainbow Tick Accreditation status. Consumer and staff interviews demonstrated EMHS LGBTQI+ inclusivity is embedded across the service.
- Implementation planning of the Psychiatrist Training Program is currently underway.

Presentation

Hon. Stephen Dawson MLC, Minister for Regional Development; Ports; Science and Innovation; Medical Research; Kimberley, attended the November Board meeting to discuss his portfolio and several planned initiatives to help EMHS develop in the research and innovation space.

The Minister acknowledged and commended the work done on the HIVE and encouraged EMHS to continue to take the insights and inspiration of the EMHS staff to further innovation and research across the organisation.
