Moorditj Wirrin Koolangkas Program

Introduction Session

- Get to know the students.
- Ice Breaker Games.
- Fun and engaging activities.

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Tobacco and Vaping Awareness

- Informing students of the harms and risks associated with Tobacco and Vaping, with the implementation of refusal skills, if offered a vape or cigarette.

Alcohol Awareness

- Informing students of the harms and risks of Alcohol and how it can affect the adolescent body.

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Healthy Relationships

- Helping students learn about different relationships and how to recognise the qualities that contribute to a healthy relationship.

Puberty and Consent Awareness

- Helping students learn about the changes of puberty, the role of personal hygiene, and how consent is an important part of relationships.

Puberty is delivered separately for Boys and Girls

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Sexual Health Awareness

- Education of safe sex practices, the use of contraceptives, and the prevention and detection of STIs and STDs, whilst building an understanding of available health checks and confidential pathways to report or seek treatment.
